President Sherris-Watt called the meeting to order at 6:34 P.M. and took roll call. President Sherris-Watt, Vice President Nottoli, Director Welsh, Director Hacaj, IGM/COP Hull, and District Administrator Wolter were present. President Sherris-Watt announced that Director Cordova would participate in the Closed Session only, by phone, from Brescia, Italy.

CLOSED SESSION PUBLIC COMMENTS

None.

The Board entered into Closed Session, by phone, at 6:34 P.M.

CLOSED SESSION

- a. Conference with legal counsel – anticipated litigation: The Board was briefed on matters involving significant exposure to litigation pursuant to California Government Code Section 54956.9(d)(2). Four items.
- b. Public Employee, discipline, or dismissal: The Board was briefed on personnel matters pursuant to Government Code Section 54957(b)(1). Four items.
- c. Public Employee Employment: Title – General Manager or Interim General Manager, The Board was briefed on personnel matters pursuant to Government Code Section 54957.

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Prior to President Sherris-Watt calling the meeting to order, she introduced Officer Doug Wilson, who sang the National Anthem. All present stood and sang with him, and at the conclusion, President Sherris-Watt thanked him.

The Board returned to Open Session at 7:36 P.M.

President Sherris-Watt took roll call. President Sherris-Watt, Vice President Nottoli, Director Welsh and Director Hacaj were present. Director Cordova was absent from the Open Session.

President Sherris-Watt announced that there was nothing to report from Closed Session.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mabry Benson said that the Board was in the process of hiring a General Manager and that she hoped the Board was looking for someone with qualifications and how the candidates would handle critical issues facing the District: Financing and budget, trimming police costs, contracting, MOU negotiations, the Community Center, and the Public Safety Building reconstruction. She said that the Board's decision would need to be made after a presentation to the public and subsequent public comments and that the community should not be presented with a "take it or leave it" selection. She said the Board should present the option(s) to the public and then make the final decision at a subsequent meeting. She said major decisions needed thoughtful consideration and should not be made in a single meeting, especially when there's been no earlier public discussion. She said taking time would also allow the Board to go back to the candidate(s) to negotiate.

Karl Kruger complimented staff for putting the notes back into the financial statements. He said he was always looking forward to this information: It allowed everyone to be aware of issues, and it saved him time.

A. Stevens Delk said there had been three items on the Closed Session agenda: Two of them were conference with Legal Counsel, anticipated litigation – four items; and public employee, employment, discipline – four items. She asked if these were four new items or if they were a continuation of old items. She said she understood there was a limited amount of information that could be provided for Closed Sessions, but it seemed to her that the public deserved to know if, each month, the Board had another four sets of things with which to deal. She said she understood the third Closed Session item – it didn't need further clarification.

Anthony Knight noted that, at a prior meeting, Director Hacaj had called in, by phone, to participate. He said the agenda had provided the specific location from where she called: The firehouse in Arnold. He said he understood that doing this was a requirement of the Brown Act, so that, if someone had happened to be in Arnold at that time, they could have participated in the District's meeting. He said he was disturbed that Director Cordova had not provided her address for this evening's meeting. He said that Brescia, Italy was a big city and that he would like to know her exact address on the agenda and to know this was a public place. Mr. Knight asked if Director Cordova was on the phone. President Sherris-Watt responded in the negative. He concluded by saying this was not an attempt to embarrass Director Cordova.

Gretchen Gillfillan said that she'd lived in Kensington 59 years and that she preferred having one meeting a month, rather than two. She encouraged everyone to participate in the Friends of the Kensington Library Book Sale on Saturday, May 13th, from 9:00 A.M. – 5:00 P.M.

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BOARD COMMENTS

President Sherris-Watt congratulated her fellow Board members because she'd asked all of them to hold meetings of their various committees and that, to date, there had been two meetings of the Finance Committee, two meetings of the Park Planning Committee, and one meeting of the Solid Waste Committee. She reported that the Park Grounds Committee and the Technology Committee had also met. She said this had been an impressive amount of work, and she thanked them for their commitment. Director Hacaj reported that the Emergency Preparedness Committee had not met but would do so shortly. She said she'd done research on this aspect of the District's business and apologized for the delay.

President Sherris-Watt extended special thanks to the Technology Committee and reported that A. Stevens Delk and David Bergen had done an exceptional job in getting everyone up to speed on the new sound system.

President Sherris-Watt reported that there would be a Closed Session meeting of the Board on the coming Saturday and that the monthly Finance Committee meeting would be held on April 26th. She added that Adam Benson of Public Law Group would attend to discuss issues regarding OPEB.

President Sherris-Watt said she'd been remiss by not including Director Cordova in the roll call. She reported that Director Cordova's health prevented her from participating in the Open Session. She added that the Board had attempted to contact Director Cordova during the Closed Session but had encountered technical difficulties. President Sherris-Watt noted that Director Cordova would be remotely participating in the Closed Session on Saturday and thus would not be accessible to any member of the public. Director Hacaj added that this was why Director Cordova's address had not been provided for the evening's agenda: She had planned to participate only in the Closed Session.

President Sherris-Watt welcomed the Board's new Legal Counsel, Ann Danforth, who received a round of applause. President Sherris-Watt reported that Ms. Danforth had many accomplishments, including having served as the City Attorney for Tiburon for almost 20 years.

Director Hacaj reported that the evening's Closed Session Item c (public employee employment – GM) and the Saturday Closed Session covered the GM process, and said she wanted to provide an update on that process. She said the Board had held at least three meetings at which it had discussed splitting the GM/COP position and that, at those meetings, the Board had enumerated the duties of the GM and the COP, which had then become incorporated into the Board's Policy and Procedures Manual. She reported that the Board was working with the management-consulting group within Public Law Group – in particular with a man named Bob Deis, who had been working with the Board on recruiting candidates for the GM position. She added that the job posting had been placed in numerous locations and publications and with various organizations. She said the Board had considered 14 resumes, interviewed five candidates, and would be interviewing two of those candidates further. She noted that the Board was working to have a GM in place by mid-May. She reported that there was more information the Board could provide: a list of skillsets and questions used during the interview process. She said the documents would be posted on the District's website and that, if the public had comments, they should get in touch with Directors. She concluded by saying the Board took seriously its responsibility to hire District staff.

Director Hacaj reported that, although the interview process for IGM/COP Hart had been done in a different manner, the tenor was now different – feelings in the community had been different at that time, with anger and frustration. She said this was no longer the case. She also noted that the interview process had been a public process and that this had caused some qualified candidates to withdraw – that was not the standard way in which to do things, especially when hiring someone at this level. She said, therefore, there would not be a public gauntlet for this candidate. She asked the public to trust that the Board was asking the right questions, seeking the right qualifications, and was being ably assisted by the consultant. A member of the public asked when the information would be on the website. Director



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Hacaj responded, "By early next week." She added that she would ask District Administrator Wolter to send it out.

President Sherris-Watt said that Bob Deis would attend the District's April 27th meeting to discuss the process, speak about his qualifications, and how he guided the Board in finding qualified candidates.

Director Welsh said he wasn't aware of the prior process having scared away any particular candidate. President Sherris-Watt responded that candidates had declined – one candidate had dropped out early and one had dropped out the day of the panel discussion. Director Welsh noted that the public process had been time-consuming and that the Board wanted to timely complete this process: The Board needed a GM and the candidates could get other offers. Therefore, he said he supported the process. He also said there had been good consensus in the Closed Session about the candidates, which he found heartening.

CONSENT CALENDAR

President Sherris-Watt asked if there were items anyone wanted pulled. Items pulled were Item e (Variance Report) and Item g (Solid Waste Committee).

Jim Watt said he agreed with Karl Kruger – it was nice to receive the footnotes in the budget. He noted that the first column in the document was incorrect: It was a repeat of the third column. He noted that the first column should reflect the increase of that month and that this made difficult to determine where the large increases had occurred. District Administrator Wolter responded that Mr. Watt was correct, she apologized for the error, and said it would not happen again. With respect to the budget, Mr. Watt said that line item 830 Legal costs had increased by \$31,000 in one month. He added that he hoped that the District's new Legal Counsel would not be running up legal bills like this. As a member of the Finance Committee, Mr. Watt reported that the District was on track to possibly end the year with a budget surplus of \$200,000. He noted that this would be the third year in a row with a budget surplus. He said he had been pushing for an increase in reserves for some time and noted that part of the reason for the surpluses had been the increases in the Levy Tax Revenue and the reduction in Police expenses because the department was operating with one less officer.

President Sherris-Watt said she had a comment on the budget. She said that, for Account 562 Vehicle Maintenance, there was a note from the Fleet Manager about staffing levels and developing the next year's budget. She said that, while she appreciated the annotations, some of them were editorializing a little bit. She said a better process would be that, if the Board had input from officers or staff that reflected on budgetary matters or policy, it probably would be better not to include it as a note but to make sure a separate email was sent. She said she hoped that IGM/COP Hull had been alerted, but if not, she hoped it was not just appearing in the report. Director Welsh said he disagreed – he thought it was valuable information. President Sherris-Watt said she didn't disagree – she wanted to make sure it hadn't only appeared here and added that it might be personal opinion. Director Welsh said he thought it was a "heads-up" – if the department returned to full staffing, it was going to have a wear and tear impact. President Sherris-Watt reiterated that she wanted to ensure that the comment didn't appear only here.

Jim Watt asked to speak about Item g (Solid Waste Committee). He said he wanted to add an item to the list of things the committee on which the Committee would be taking action. He said that he'd been involved in discussions about the Bay View contract and that, in the contract, the District had agreed to increase the fee it would collect, from 5% to 7%. He noted that the District knew at that time, that it would be required to pay 3% to the County. He said an additional 2% would come to the District – the total to the District would increase from 2% to 4%. He said the rationale given at that time had been that the District didn't know if the County's fee percent would increase under the terms of a newly negotiated agreement – increasing the total from 5% to 7% was expected to provide a cushion. He noted that the draft MOU with the County indicated that the 3% fee would remain intact. He said it wasn't necessary to continue to have the ratepayers continue to pay 4% to the District under these

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circumstances and added that the Franchise Fee could be used only for the specific intent involved with the particular issue at hand. He said the annual amount the District was collecting at the 4% rate was about \$60,000. Over the term of the contract, he said that this would amount to a large sum, that this money could be used only for solid waste purposes, and that it would distort perceptions about what the District really had: The franchise fees would represent about \$60,000 of the District's \$200,000 surplus for the year. He asked Vice President Nottoli if she and her Committee would ask Bay View Refuse if it would consider reducing the franchise fees in exchange for reducing a future rate increase for Kensington's ratepayers. In response, Director Welsh said that the District could renegotiate the Bay View contract any time it wanted, to make that kind of switch, but that he thought it was premature to do so because the County could raise the fee it charged anytime it wanted, if it could document its cost increases. He added that he thought this was likely, given changes that could occur with legislation and waste disposal requirements. Director Welsh noted that it would behoove the District to accumulate a bit of a reserve, even though this reserve had restrictions on its use.

MOTION: Director Welsh moved, and Vice President Nottoli seconded, to adopt the Consent Calendar.

NEW BUSINESS

- 7a. Discussion of Wi-Fi policy for the Community Center. Vice President Nottoli updated and informed the Board about different possibilities for making Wi-Fi available to the users of the Community Center.

Vice President Nottoli reported that there was Wi-Fi service in the Community Center with HughesNet Satellite. She said the District had been looking into alternatives to the satellite service because it didn't work well in bad weather. She added that AT&T was an alternate but was a more expensive one. She noted that the HughesNet fee was \$182 per month and that AT&T was about twice this amount. She reported that the Wi-Fi password was "KensingtonCC," and that the Board would be monitoring the use of this over time. She said that, with others having the password, there would be no way to limit use, which could result in the District using its monthly allotment early in each month. This, she said, could cause the system to operate slowly. President Sherris-Watt asked if it would be possible to change the password. Vice President Nottoli responded in the affirmative and said it could be changed monthly. Director Hacaj asked if the password would be posted on the bulletin board or if it would be provided only for certain events. Vice President Nottoli reiterated that monthly usage would be monitored and that the monthly allotment was five megabytes. Director Hacaj said that, given the limited allotment, perhaps access should be limited to Board meetings. Director Welsh recommended beginning conservatively with this and then expanded access incrementally. President Sherris-Watt noted that youth groups might be excited to have access during their gatherings, especially because so many children carry cell phones now. She also suggested making the password available to KASEP teachers, the fly-fishermen, and fundraising groups. Director Welsh asked about what weather problems might impact the satellite. Vice President Nottoli responded that winter weather and summer fog could pose problems and reiterated that the satellite option was less expensive. She noted that, at the higher price, AT&T would provide more bandwidth. President Sherris-Watt suggested starting the process and the soliciting community input. Director Welsh asked if there were other providers to consider, such as Comcast. Vice President Nottoli responded that other providers would need to have a cable line. Director Hacaj asked if there was a draft policy to consider. President Sherris-Watt responded that this was for discussion only.

MOTION: Vice President Nottoli moved, and Director Welsh seconded, that there be limited distribution of the password and see how that works out and see what the usage is over time and that, in the meantime, they would continue to explore other options to Hughes.

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Motion passed: 4 – 0.

- 7b. Review and possibly adopt the Amended Memorandum of Understanding between the KPPCSD and Contra Costa County for meeting the requirements of the California Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989.

President Sherris-Watt reported that this Amended Memorandum of Understanding dealt with requirements related to the District's solid waste contract and what fees the District needed to pay to the County. She reported that the District currently paid a franchise fee of 3% of Bay View's gross receipts to the County and the new MOU did not show an increase in those rates.

Jim Watt said that he'd done contracts for almost 40 years for a living and that he enjoyed reviewing such things. He said that he wanted to repeat something he'd said at previous meetings: When there were agenda items like this, which involved a sum of money – in this case 3% on \$1.5 million, or \$45,000 per year, there should be a summary about why the District was doing this contract, the background of the contract, and the cost of it. He said he'd like to see a summary of anything coming up for final approval. With respect to the contract, he said that, on Page 2 Item K, it said that the 1997 MOU was scheduled to expire on September 1, 2016. He said this bothered him because he could remember that, around that time, former IGM/COP Hart had said the District needed to work on the contract and get it reinstated. Because the contract had expired, he said the proposed MOU wasn't an amendment: It was a new contract. Therefore, he said he would prefer to see the word amendment deleted.

Mr. Watt said he was bothered that there was a contract in the agenda packet and it contained reference to an Exhibit B, but there was no Exhibit B attached. He said he wanted to see what this exhibit contained because it contained the District's obligations to the County and the State.

Mr. Watt said that, on Page 8 of the MOU, there was discussion about the term of the contract; specifically the term was September 1, 2016 through August 31, 2023, but later, the document said the contract would automatically terminate one year after the termination of the Franchise Agreement, unless the District entered into a new franchise agreement that provided for the effective implementation of the obligations.

Mr. Watt said the most important thing was that, the prior contract – which had been entered into in 1997 and had run for 19 years, had included reference to Bay View Refuse and the restrictions imposed upon that service provider. He said that Bay View Refuse had agreed to comply with the applicable terms and that Bay View had been a signatory to this document. Therefore, he said Bay View should be a signatory to this proposed MOU. He said that the prior agreement contained many provisions with which the District had to comply and that there was probably little information going to the County on a quarterly basis. Vice President Nottoli clarified that this was diversion rate information. District Administrator Wolter responded that, under the prior agreement with Bay View Refuse, Bay View Refuse sent that information directly to the County. Director Welsh said that there was a perfectly fine relationship among Bay View, the County, and KPPCSD and that if the County wanted something from Bay View, the County would go to the service provider and ask for it and that if Bay View needed something from KPPCSD it would call District Administrator Wolter. In sum, he said everything was working fine, though it hadn't always been that way in the past. Director Welsh added that the Bay View contract contained provisions requiring it to comply with County provisions. He noted that the County had said Bay View didn't need to sign this proposed MOU.

Mr. Watt said that, since 1997, the District had been contributing 3% to the County. He said that he wasn't sure how that number had been derived and that it was confusing how the County would justify changing this. He said it was likely that the KPPCSD was paying more than the amount of the costs the County was incurring on the District's behalf. Director Welsh responded that the County hadn't said

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how the amount had been calculated but that it was clear that the County was talking about its administrative costs. He added that an inquiry could be made to see how well the County justified it. Mr. Watt noted that, perhaps, there could be an opportunity to reduce this percentage based on the County's actual costs.

President Sherris-Watt said that, for brevity, the Bay View contract had not been included in the Board Packet, that this complete contract was on the District's website, and that this contract contained the amendments and exhibits referred to in the proposed MOU with the County.

A.Stevens Delk said that the previous contract with Bay View had actually ended in 2015, and the concurrent one with the County had ended one year later. She said this one-year lag had probably been a failsafe on the County's part so that, if the contract with Bay View had ended, the County would have had one year to collect its money. She said that the proposed MOU would end in the same year as the Bay View contract and that the language about extending one year beyond the Bay View contract's termination probably had the same intent as the prior County MOU – to ensure it didn't get shortchanged.

Ms. Delk said the proposed MOU mentioned the 3%, but it didn't mention when the District had to pay it to the County. She added that the prior fiscal year had been the first year of the Bay View contract with the District, which switched from the Bay View paying the County directly to Bay View paying the District and the District then paying the County. She said that, for one year, the District hadn't paid the County, but that, in September 2016, there had been a \$35,000 reduction in the revenue the District had received from Bay View. She said that, at that time, she'd asked what had happened to the revenue and that the explanation provided by District Administrator Wolter and the District's CPA had been that this had been the franchise fee money the District had had to send to the County. She said she didn't think this should have been treated as a reduction in revenue; instead, it should have been treated as an expense. She reiterated that the contract didn't specify when the District had to pay the County. She said the prior Bay View contract had said that the Bay View would pay the District every month, based on the gross receipts of the previous month. President Sherris-Watt responded that she thought IGM/COP Hull could answer this question. Ms. Delk continued by saying that Bay View billed ratepayers three times a year and that, during the first month following billing, about 70% of customers paid and that the rest of the customers paid over the next three months. She added that, in the middle of March, she had received a second notice from Bay View telling her she'd owe a \$20 late fee if her payment wasn't received by April 15th. She said such fees were not mentioned in the Bay View contract. Director Welsh encouraged Ms. Delk to raise her billing issues with the Solid Waste Committee.

IGM/COP Hull said he wanted to speak to the payment schedule: The District was sending the franchise fee to the County. He added that Bay View was sending the 7% to the District monthly and that, out of that money, the District calculated the 3% and then prepared a check to send to the County. Thus, he said the payments were being made monthly.

Clearly this board has taken great pains to obtain a panel of qualified candidates who can serve as possible part-time general managers of our district. What it has NOT done however is provided that this process includes an open, transparent and public interview process for this selection or at least none is mentioned in this statement below.

I wish to remind this board that it is breaking with long standing tradition of public participation and public interviews of all candidates for this job for at least the last 10 years. I know of no reason why this should occur. I have heard that there is fear that qualified candidates will not participate if they have to run a gauntlet of public interviews; I find that ludicrous. I wish to point out that most major public appointments are routinely made subject to public review and questioning—we have only to look recently to the committee hearings on now Supreme Court Justice Neil Gorsuch, as well as the public review of the entirety of the current presidential cabinet for Mr. Trump.

I see no reason why our own local hamlet should be any less transparent in its interview process or allow a group of five board members to have sole decision making over this selection, particularly given the prior participation of this board (including its current president) and past boards in an open and public process.

Please provide this as part of the next agenda packet in the public correspondence section.

Below is the explanation, written by Director Hacaj, for the emails sent yesterday about the GM skillsets and possible interview questions.

At the April 13 Kensington Police Protection and Community Services District (KPPCSD) Board meeting the Board provided a summary of the process for recruiting the recently separated position of General Manager.

The separation of the General Manager role from that of the Chief of Police was considered at 3 regular meetings of the Board (February 9, 23 and March 9, 2017). Public comment was accepted at each of those meetings and on March 9, the Board finalized the vote to amend the District's Policy and Procedure manual to separate the positions and specify the basic responsibilities of each role.

The job description was posted on the KPPCSD website and circulated to an email list of 100+ retired city managers, and a similar job posting listed on multiple sites including the CA Special District Association; affiliates of the Bay Area News Group (East Bay Times, The Mercury News, Oakland Tribune, the Daily News, Hayward Daily Review, Fremont Argus, and Hills Publications including Piedmonter, Berkeley Voice, El Cerrito Journal and Alameda Journal); and Monster.com, which is networked to numerous social and job niche sites.

Of the resumes received, 14 were best matched to the job qualifications and given additional review and consideration. Of those, 5 candidates were selected for a first round of interviews and 2 were brought back for a second round.

The Board engaged the services of Bob Deis, a consultant with Public Management Group, to assist in this process.

He captured a list of skill sets the Board is targeting and developed interview questions for the Board's consideration. As was agreed by the Board on April 13, these documents are attached and posted on the District's website.

Opposition to jail expansion could cost El Cerrito dispatch contract

EL CERRITO — Contra Costa County Sheriff David Livingston pledges to back out of a five-year deal to provide police dispatch services to the city because of its formal opposition to a proposed expansion of the West County jail.

If that Jan. 17 agreement is voided, El Cerrito could face paying \$750,000 over the next five years in added dispatch costs, according to a Friday email from El Cerrito City Manager Scott Hanin to City Council members.

Livingston notified El Cerrito Mayor Janet Abelson in a Monday morning letter that the council's April 4 letter to the California Board of State and Community Corrections opposing the sheriff's \$70 million grant request for the jail calls into question the "cooperation, mutual respect and an understanding of the duties and obligations" of the sheriff and the city. Livingston said his office is "no longer considering" that five-year agreement.

"Unfortunately, the El Cerrito City Council put politics ahead of good public policy," Livingston said Monday in a statement. "They weighed into a matter that has zero impact on the citizens of El Cerrito and ironically attacked the very agency they now want services from. In doing so, they demonstrated they cannot be good public safety partners."

El Cerrito Councilwoman Rochelle Pardue-Okimoto said Monday she is "not completely surprised" that Livingston has taken this stance. "It is more disappointing than surprising to see an elected official would retaliate against a city and its residents over an unrelated matter."

Pardue-Okimoto said she and the council will weigh their options regarding both a response to the Sheriff's Office and police dispatching. The city's current dispatch contract with the city of Richmond ends June 30. "If the sheriff won't cooperate with us, we'll have to find other means. We have to have these services."

In its April 4 letter, the El Cerrito council said the jail-expansion money should instead be spent on programs to help prisoners re-enter society or help keep them out of jail entirely, or perhaps on a full-service hospital. The Doctors Medical Center in San Pablo closed two years ago.

The Richmond City Council voted in 2015 to oppose the jail expansion. And on Friday, state Sen. Nancy Skinner, D-Oakland, asked the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors to reverse its approval of the jail expansion, saying it promotes incarceration instead of helping keep people out of jail.

Contra Costa County Supervisor John Gioia said Monday he considers Livingston's move unfair and unjustified, and has asked county Administrator David Twa to work with Livingston to save the dispatch agreement.

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Gioia was the lone "no" vote when the Board of Supervisors on Feb. 7 voted 4-1 to support the 120,000-square-foot, 400-bed jail-expansion project. He decried the fact the county will still have to contribute \$25 million in one-time construction costs to the project, and said any new or expanded jail should place a greater emphasis on mental health treatment.

Monday, he also questioned Livingston walking away from a \$2.5 million, five-year contract. "That's his department giving up that revenue," Gioia said.

In his Friday email to council members, Hanin said that if El Cerrito's contract with the Sheriff's Office can't be salvaged, the city would likely be forced to re-up with Richmond for dispatch services, at a considerable cost — about \$3.25 million. That extra \$750,000, Hanin told council members, could mean service cuts within the city, and could also impact contract talks with city employees.

Also on Jan. 17, El Cerrito approved a three-year agreement for the Contra Costa County Fire Protection District to provide fire dispatch services for the city. That agreement takes effect June 1. The fire dispatch agreement is not affected by whatever happens with the police dispatch agreement, Gioia said.

Re: MOU with Contra Costa County

Dear Mr. Hull,

Section 2.9 of the MOU for Integrated Waste Management with Contra Costa County should not be approved by the KPPCSD Board. This section requires KPPCSD to provide the County's garbage service at the Library. KPPCSD requires its contractor, Bay View Refuse to provide this service at no charge to KPPCSD. Bayview in turn, incorporates their cost to provide this service in the rates charged to Kensington rate payers. There is no language in the current Franchise agreement that prohibits Bayview from passing along this cost.

I believe that the practice used to implement section 2.9 of the MOU is in violation of Proposition 218. (Article XIIIID of the California Constitution). A key tenant of Prop. 218 is that a fee must only be set to recover the cost to provide a "property related service". Garbage collection for the county's facilities is not a direct property related service to property owners and residents. Several years ago, the KPPCSD Rate Consultant identified the refuse collection costs for both the library and the community center that were passed on to rate payers. Although rate reviews are no longer conducted, the current rates that Kensington residents pay are based on this practice. The County is already receiving a 3% franchise fee paid by Kensington rate payers, perhaps they can utilize these funds to cover the cost of garbage service at their facilities.

For Board members not familiar with the complexities of Proposition 218 which was passed in 1996, I've excerpted some of the applicable sections regarding Property Related Fees for Service:

- (b) Requirements for Existing, New or Increased Fees and Charges. A fee or charge shall not be extended, imposed, or increased by any agency unless it meets all of the following requirements:
- (1) Revenues derived from the fee or charge shall not exceed the funds required to provide the property related service.
 - (2) Revenues derived from the fee or charge shall not be used for any purpose other than that for which the fee or charge was imposed.
 - (3) The amount of a fee or charge imposed upon any parcel or person as an incident of property ownership shall not exceed the proportional cost of the service attributable to the parcel.
 - (4) No fee or charge may be imposed for a service unless that service is actually used by, or immediately available to, the owner of the property in question. Fees or charges based on potential or future use of a service are not permitted. Standby charges, whether

characterized as charges or assessments, shall be classified as assessments and shall not be imposed without compliance with Section 4.

(5) No fee or charge may be imposed for general governmental services including, but not limited to, police, fire, ambulance or library services, where the service is available to the public at large in substantially the same manner as it is to property owners. Reliance by an agency on any parcel map, including, but not limited to, an assessor's parcel map, may be considered a significant factor in determining whether a fee or charge is imposed as an incident of property ownership for purposes of this article. In any legal action contesting the validity of a fee or charge, the burden shall be on the agency to demonstrate compliance with this article.

POLICE DISPATCH AND RECORDS SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Police Dispatch and Records Services Agreement (hereinafter "Agreement") is made and entered into by and between the City of Albany, a municipal corporation (hereinafter "Albany"), and the Kensington Police Protection and Community Services District, a California public services special district (hereinafter "KPPCSD"). Albany and KPPCSD may be collectively referred to herein as the "parties."

RECITALS

- A.** The Albany Police Public Safety Dispatch Center is a primary Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) as defined by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC PSAP Registry Identification #525).
- B.** The Albany Police Public Safety Dispatch Center provides essential public safety dispatch communications and performs a variety of routine records functions related to the use of computerized dispatch and police information systems and databases.
- C.** KPPCSD wishes to contract with Albany for the provision of emergency PSAP telephone, police dispatch and records management services.
- D.** Contracting for the provision of said services will result in cost savings and increased public safety efficiencies for both parties.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL COVENANTS AND CONDITIONS IDENTIFIED HEREIN, THE PARTIES HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. SCOPE OF POLICE DISPATCH AND RECORDS SERVICES

After the technology and infrastructure is in place, which the parties estimate to occur on or about July 1, 2017, Albany shall provide to KPPCSD the services ("Police Dispatch and Records Services") described in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, in accordance with the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement.

2. TERM

This Agreement shall become effective on the date the Agreement is fully executed. Upon execution of this Agreement, Albany will begin implementation of acquiring and building the technology and infrastructure to provide Police Dispatch and Records Services to KPPCSD. The Police Dispatch and Records Services provided by this Agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years commencing once Albany has the technology and infrastructure in place and begins providing the Police Dispatch and Records Services, which the parties estimate will be July 1, 2017, and, thus, ending on June 30, 2020 ("Termination Date").

3. TERMINATION

- A. Termination without Cause.** Neither party may terminate this Agreement without cause within the first two (2) years of this Agreement. If either party wishes to terminate this Agreement without cause after two (2) years and before the Termination Date, said party shall deliver a one-hundred twenty (120) day written notice to the other party of its intent to terminate.
- B. Termination for Cause.** If either party fails to cure any material breach, following notice and opportunity to cure, either party, upon written notice to the other, may terminate this Agreement for cause. The termination shall be effective not less than ninety (90) days from the date of the notice or such longer time as determined by both parties.
- C. Licenses.** Upon termination of this Agreement, licenses to systems and application software shall be distributed as listed in Exhibit "B." All costs and responsibility for data conversion associated with KPPCSD's data shall be KPPCSD's responsibility.

4. AGREEMENT COSTS

In consideration of Albany's performance of the services described in Paragraph 1 and Exhibit A, KPPCSD shall pay annually, pursuant to items 4A through 4F below, for the services rendered under this Agreement.

- A. PSAP and Police Radio Dispatch Services:** \$80,000
- B. Records Management Services:** \$5,000
- C. Technology Services:** \$12,000
- D. Total Annual Cost for Agreement:** \$97,000
- E. Annual Adjustment.** The Total Annual Cost for Agreement is subject to annual adjustments at the beginning of the fiscal year (July 1) based upon the Consumer Price Index, Consolidated Metropolitan Statistical Area covering San Francisco-Oakland-San Jose, for the twelve (12) month period ending April 30 of the preceding year, or five percent (5%), whichever is lower. This annual calculation will be based upon the Total Annual Cost for Agreement shown in Item 4D above irrespective of Item 4F below.
- F.** During the first year of the Agreement, the PSAP and Police Radio Dispatch Services cost will be prorated to \$53,333, resulting in a first-year/one-time Total Annual Cost for Agreement of \$70,333.
- G.** Upon completion of twelve (12) months of continuous service under the terms of this agreement, parties agree to meet and discuss the Technology Services fee and adjust it if necessary to reflect actual costs for providing the services described in Exhibit "A".

5. PAYMENT

Once Albany begins providing services under the Agreement, Albany shall send an annual invoice (July 1) to KPPCSD which shall include the fee for PSAP and Police Radio Dispatch Services, Records Management Services, and Technology Services. KPPCSD shall pay annual invoices within thirty (30) calendar days of the date of the invoice. After thirty (30) calendar days, payment shall be considered late and a material breach under Paragraph 16 of this Agreement.

6. COMPUTER AIDED DISPATCHING AND RECORDS MANAGEMENT (CAD & RMS) SYSTEMS

KPPCSD will purchase and/or license all Sun Ridge Systems CAD and RMS software necessary to implement this Agreement, including licensed ancillary modules, to the multi-agency versions of the software and pay all implementation costs related to the software system upgrade, including hardware, to enable the software and Albany staff to provide Dispatch and Records Services to both parties.

Upon completion of the purchase and installation of CAD software, including licensed ancillary modules and necessary hardware, KPPCSD data and software will be migrated over to Albany's CAD system and shall be supported as part of Albany's system, at which point KPPCSD will be deemed an add-on agency to Albany.

7. AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES; QUARTERLY MEETINGS

The Albany City Manager and the KPPCSD General Manager are the authorized representatives of Albany and KPPCSD respectively for purposes of administration of this Agreement. These Managers, or their designees, shall meet quarterly or as needed to discuss issues pertaining to:

- Operational issues, including changes to service delivery
- Technical issues related to information technology and system components
- Dispatch operational issues related to field unit reporting and system status management

Additionally, these Managers, or their designees, may from time to time agree in writing to modify the services described in Exhibit A as deemed necessary to further the purposes of this Agreement.

8. ADDITIONAL USERS OF THE DISPATCH CENTER

Both parties acknowledge and agree that Albany may provide dispatch services to other agencies, including the Albany Fire Department, without the consent of KPPCSD.

9. NONDISCRIMINATION

The parties shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws regarding nondiscriminatory employment practices, whether or not said laws are expressly stated in this Agreement. The parties shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, color, religious creed, national origin, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, marital status, sexual orientation, or sex.

10. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The parties shall comply with all applicable legal requirements including all federal, state, and local laws (including ordinances and resolutions), whether or not said laws are expressly stated in this Agreement.

11. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

- A. Defined.** The term "Confidential Information" shall mean any and all information which is disclosed by either party ("Owner") to the other ("Recipient") verbally, electronically, visually, or in a written or other tangible form which is either identified or should be reasonably understood to be confidential or proprietary. Confidential Information includes, but is not limited to, trade secrets, computer programs, software, documentation, formulas, data, inventions, techniques, marketing plans, strategies, forecasts, customer lists, employee information, financial information, confidential information concerning Owner's business, as Owner has conducted it or as it may conduct itself in the future, confidential information concerning any of Owner's past, current, or possible future products or manufacturing or operational methods, including information about Owner's research, development, engineering, purchasing, manufacturing, accounting, marketing, selling or leasing, and any software (including third party software) provided by Owner. Owner's Confidential Information shall be treated as strictly confidential by Recipient and shall not be disclosed by Recipient except to those third parties with a need to know and that are operating under a confidentiality agreement with non-disclosure provisions no less restrictive than those set forth herein. This Agreement imposes no obligation upon the parties with respect to Confidential Information which either party can establish by legally sufficient evidence: (a) was in the possession of, or was rightfully known by the Recipient without an obligation to maintain its confidentiality prior to receipt from Owner; (b) is or becomes generally known to the public without violation of this Agreement; (c) is obtained by Recipient in good faith from a third party having the right to disclose it without an obligation on confidentiality; (d) is independently developed by Recipient without the participation of individuals who have had access to the Confidential Information or (e) is required to be disclosed by court order or applicable law, provided prior notice is given to the Owner. The Recipient shall not obtain, by virtue of this Agreement, any rights title or interest in any Confidential Information of the Owner. Within fifteen (15) days after termination of this Agreement, each Recipient shall certify in writing to Owner that all copies of Owner's Confidential Information in any form, including partial copies, have been destroyed or returned to Owner.

Both parties acknowledge that either party may be required to release information under requests made under the provisions of the California Public Records Act or the laws governing discovery in civil or criminal litigation.

- B. Standard of Care.** Recipient shall protect the deliverables resulting from Services with at least the same degree of care and confidentiality, but not less than a reasonable standard of care, which Recipient utilizes for Recipient's Confidential Information.
- C. Survival.** The terms of this Paragraph 11 shall survive termination of this Agreement.

12. INDEMNIFICATION.

- A. Indemnification and Hold Harmless.** Each party shall indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the other party (including its elected officials, officers, agents and employees) from and against any and all claims (including all litigation, demands, damages, liabilities, costs, and expenses, and including court costs and attorney's fees) resulting or arising from that party's performance, or failure to perform, under this Agreement.
- B. Copyright and Patent Indemnification.** Claims which trigger Albany's responsibility under Paragraph 12A shall include any claims that the software resulting from the provision of Services pursuant to the attached Exhibit A infringe any patent, copyright, or accidental or intentional violation of a trade secret or other intellectual property of a third party not included in this Agreement. Albany shall, in its reasonable judgment and at its option and expense: (i) obtain for the parties the right to continue using the Software; or (ii) replace or modify the Software so that it becomes non-infringing while giving equivalent performance. Albany shall not have any liability for a claim alleging that any Software infringes a patent or copyright if the alleged infringement was developed based on information furnished by KPPCSD or if the alleged infringement is the result of a modification made by KPPCSD.

13. FORCE MAJEURE

If by reason of force majeure Albany is unable in whole or in part to perform the services under this Agreement, Albany shall not be in default during the continuance of such inability. The term "force majeure" as used herein shall mean the following: acts of God; strikes, lockouts or other industrial disturbances; acts of public enemies; orders or restraints of any kind of the government of the United States or of the State or any of their departments, agencies or officials, or any civil or military authority; insurrections, riots, landslides, earthquakes, fires, storms, droughts, floods, explosions, breakage or accident to machinery, transmission pipes or canals; or any other cause or event not reasonably within the control of Albany.

14. RELATIONSHIP OF THE PARTIES

It is expressly understood that this is an agreement between two independent contractors

and that no agency, employee, partnership, joint venture or other relationship is established by the Agreement. Nothing contained in this Agreement is intended to, nor shall it be construed in any way, to be a joint powers agreement of any kind. The employees of Albany and KPPCSD shall remain employees of each respective party and shall not by virtue of this Agreement become employees of the other party or become entitled to receive compensation or benefits from the other party.

15. ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTS AND AGREEMENTS

The parties agree to cooperate in the execution of any additional policies and procedures, which may be required to carry out the terms of this Agreement.

16. MATERIAL BREACH; NOTICE OF DEFAULT

If either party ("demanding party") has a reasonable, good faith belief that the other party ("defaulting party") has committed a material breach of the terms of this Agreement, the demanding party shall give written notice of the default (with reasonable specificity) to the defaulting party, and demand the default to be cured within ten days of the notice. If: (a) the defaulting party fails to cure the default within ten days of the notice, or, (b) if more than ten days are reasonably required to cure the default and the defaulting party fails to give adequate written assurance of due performance within ten days of the notice, then (c) the demanding party may terminate this Agreement upon written notice to the defaulting party. As used in this Agreement, the term "material breach" shall refer to a failure of either party to comply with its obligations under this Agreement in a manner which substantially affects the rights of the other party.

17. CONTINUOUS SERVICE DELIVERY

Albany agrees that there is a public health and safety obligation to assist KPPCSD in every effort to ensure uninterrupted and continuous service delivery in the event of a material breach, even if Albany disagrees with the alleged determination of material breach. Accordingly, Albany will continue to provide services under this Agreement during any dispute resolution process. Additionally, in the event the Agreement is terminated for any reason, Albany shall cooperate with KPPCSD in its transition to a new service provider.

18. WARRANTY

Albany provides the hardware, software, and ancillary systems without any warranty or condition, expressed or implied. Albany specifically disclaims any implied warranties of title, merchantability, fitness for a purpose, and non-infringement. KPPCSD acknowledges that the systems may not operate totally without interruption. Albany makes no representations, warranties, or guarantees regarding uptime for the systems. Albany agrees to pursue remedies through the vendor for the systems to all software problems arising from software provided by the vendor. Remedies for problems arising

that are caused by circumstances outside of the vendor' s control (network connection issues, user errors, hardware failures, etc.) shall be pursued by Albany until a resolution is achieved. If a total or partial failure should occur, Albany Police dispatch shall continue to dispatch for KPPCSD using whatever manual methods may be necessary and provide the same level of service they would for the Albany Police Department.

19. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- A. In the event that either party disputes any provision or interpretation of or performance under this Agreement, including cost of service or billing, or contends there has been a material breach of the Agreement, the parties shall meet to attempt to resolve the dispute. Disputes not resolved at the City/General Manager and Police Chief (or his/her designee) level may be escalated by giving written notice to the other party of the need to proceed with mediation. It is the Parties' intention to avoid the cost of litigation and to resolve any issues that may arise amicably if possible.
- B. Within ten (10) business days from the effective date, pursuant to Paragraph 20, of written notice from one party to the other indicating that a dispute is to be mediated, the parties shall mutually select one person who shall mediate the dispute. The parties should select a qualified professional with expertise in the subject matter of the dispute. If the parties are unable to mutually agree upon a mediator within fourteen (14) business days following the notice, the parties shall each designate one person as a mediator within twenty (20) business days following the notice.
- C. These two designated mediators shall mutually select a third mediator (also a qualified professional with expertise in the subject of the dispute) within twenty (20) business days of the notice. The one selected mediator shall mediate the dispute. The mediation shall be completed within thirty (30) business days of the appointment of the mediator. The mediation shall be conducted in accordance with the discretion of the mediator. However, if the mediator is unable to resolve the dispute within thirty (30) business days and the parties do not agree to an extension of time, the mediator shall submit specific and written recommendations for full resolution of the dispute within ten (10) business days thereafter. The parties shall consider the written recommendations of the mediator.
- D. The fees and expenses of the one selected mediator shall be divided equally between the Parties. The above deadlines shall be enforced unless extensions are mutually agreed upon or granted to either party by the mediator for good cause shown.

20. NOTICES

All notices required or contemplated by this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered to the respective party as set forth in this section. Communications shall be deemed to be effective upon the first to occur of: (a) actual receipt by a party's Authorized Representative, or (b) actual receipt at the address designated below, or (c) three (3) working days following deposit in the United States Mail of registered or

certified mail sent to the address designated below. The Authorized Representative of either party may modify their respective contact information identified in this section by providing notice to the other party.

21. HEADINGS

The heading titles for each paragraph of this Agreement are included only as a guide to the contents and are not to be considered as controlling, enlarging, or restricting the interpretation of the Agreement.

22. SEVERABILITY

If any term of this Agreement (including any phrase, provision, covenant, or condition) is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, the Agreement shall be construed as not containing that term, and the remainder of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect; provided, however, this paragraph shall not be applied to the extent that it would result in a frustration of the parties' intent under this Agreement.

23. GOVERNING LAW, JURISDICTION AND VENUE

The interpretation, validity, and enforcement of this Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of California. Any suit, claim, or legal proceeding of any kind related to this Agreement shall be filed and heard in a court of competent jurisdiction in the County of Alameda.

24. ASSIGNMENT AND DELEGATION

This Agreement, and any portion thereof, shall not be assigned or transferred, nor shall any of the parties' duties be delegated, without the written consent of the other party. Any attempt to assign or delegate this Agreement without the written consent of the other party shall be void and of no force or effect. Consent by a party to one assignment shall not be deemed to be consent to any subsequent assignment.

25. SUCCESSORS

This Agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of all successors and assigns of the parties and any associates in interest, and their respective directors, officers, agents, servants, and employees, and the successors and assigns of each of them, separately and collectively.

26. MODIFICATIONS

This Agreement may not be modified orally or in any manner other than by an agreement in writing signed by the Authorized Representatives of both parties.

27. WAIVERS

Waiver of a breach or default under this Agreement shall not constitute a continuing waiver or a waiver of a subsequent breach of the same or any other provision of this Agreement.

28. CONFLICTS

If any conflicts arise between the terms and conditions of this Agreement and the terms and conditions of the attached exhibits or any documents expressly incorporated, the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall control.

29. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement, including all documents incorporated herein by reference, comprises the entire integrated understanding between the parties concerning the services described herein. This Agreement supersedes all prior negotiations, agreements, and understandings regarding this matter, whether written or oral. The documents incorporated by reference into this Agreement are complementary; what is called for in one is binding as if called for in all.

30. SIGNATURES

The individuals executing this Agreement represent and warrant that they have the right, power, legal capacity, and authority to enter and to execute this Agreement on behalf of the respective legal entities of The City of Albany and the Kensington Police Protection and Community Services District. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, Albany and KPPCSD do hereby agree to the full performance of the terms set forth herein.

EXHIBIT "A"
Scope of Services

- I. During the term of this Agreement, Albany shall provide to KPPCSD and be responsible for the services described in this Exhibit "A".
- A. Police General Dispatch Service
1. Provide all dispatch services identified in this Exhibit "A" to all KPPCSD police officers.
 2. Receive and respond to all 911 calls for police services for KPPCSD twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week. 911 telephone lines will be answered using a generic greeting such as, "Emergency Services" or "9-1-1 Emergency."
 3. Receive and respond to all non-emergency calls for police services for KPPCSD twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week utilizing a dedicated non-emergency police services telephone line which will be answered using a greeting such as, "Kensington Police" or "Police Services."
 4. Transfer all emergency fire and medical calls to a secondary PSAP for dispatch.
 5. Transfer all 911 telephone calls to a secondary public safety answering point when determined to be appropriate.
 6. Monitor and reply to all emergency radio traffic from KPPCSD twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week.
 7. Monitor and reply to all non-emergency radio traffic from KPPCSD twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week.
 8. Provide call-out notifications as directed by KPPCSD for incidents requiring

response from KPPCSD's off-duty police department personnel or mutual aid resources.

9. Utilize appropriate radio and computer-aided dispatch (CAD) systems for police dispatching services.
10. Make telephone calls for police officers to request tow trucks, taxi cabs, and other resources.
11. Use KPPCSD unit requirements for dispatching calls for service to KPPCSD officers.
12. Prioritize response per Albany Lexipol Policy.
13. Use tone alerts, and Code 33 activations per Albany emergency protocols.

B. Police Dispatch Technology Criteria and Guidelines

1. Operate and maintain a computer-aided dispatch (CAD) system that is capable of:
 - a. Tracking the status of KPPCSD's on-duty police units' activity and availability.
 - b. Assigning report numbers for incidents.
 - c. Ensuring that Albany systems and electronic interfaces are maintained and working.
2. Utilize the East Bay Regional Communications System Authority (EBRCSA) radio system for dispatch communications.
3. Operate KPPCSD police dispatch on a mutually shared radio channel: both KPPCSD and Albany, will communicate on Albany's main radio channel.

C. Computer-Aided Dispatch (CAD) and Records Management System (RMS)

1. Host and maintain the CAD and RMS applications, database, and backups and provide twenty-four (24) hours, seven (7) days a week of operational support of the servers and applications.
2. The Albany Administrative Sergeant will be the main contact for any issues related to the applications and will contact Albany Information Technology Support/Help Desk personnel following Albany's current normal business hour (0800 hours to 1700 hours) and after-hour (1700 hours to 0800 hours) procedures.
3. Host and maintain the servers, CAD and RMS along with ancillary applications, databases, system administration, and necessary local interfaces for the systems.
4. Maintain and support the servers and the hardware necessary for the operation of the systems.
5. Monitor new technology to maintain technologically current systems.
6. Be solely responsible for determining the hardware and software that will maximize benefits to both Albany and KPPCSD.
7. Provide the ability for designated KPPCSD workstations (including MDCs) to perform CLETS queries.
8. Assist KPPCSD to resolve any issues with the operation of the mobile software as a result of issues with the CAD application.
9. Create accounts necessary for KPPCSD to access the CAD and RMS applications within five (5) days of the date that request is received from KPPCSD.

10. Be responsible for all CAD file maintenance including user accounts, CAD terminals, and periodic software updates.
11. Report and track issues with the CAD/ RMS vendor.
12. Respond to Public Records Act requests or similar requests and subpoenas for incidents and/or addresses located in Albany.

D. Network Connectivity

1. Provide a dedicated connection at Albany's dispatch center to establish communications with KPPCSD's network to allow for connectivity with CAD and RMS.

E. Ancillary Services

1. Conduct inquiries for officers into federal, state, and local databases through the California Law Enforcement Telecommunications System (CLETS).
2. Complete mandated entries into federal and state databases (e.g., MUPS, DVROS, AFS, SVS).
3. Be the Custodian of Record of all PSAP telephone audio recordings.
4. Process audio recording requests for criminal, civil, and internal cases that are recorded by Albany and provide copies of records to KPPCSD following Albany's request procedure.
5. Albany Administrative Sergeant will be responsible for CJIS audits, yearly training and sign-offs for Albany only.
6. Maintain and manage the ORI (Originating Agency Identifier) and mnemonics for both Albany and KPPCSD with the DOJ, if the DOJ approves the consolidated CAD network and system to be one system. If DOJ considers the consolidated CAD network and system to be two separate systems, Albany will maintain and manage the ORI and mnemonics for Albany only.

F. Mobile Data Computer (MDC) System

1. Maintain a NetMotion license to provide the connectivity of up to seven (7) KPPCSD MDCs to the Albany CAD system.
2. Assist KPPCSD as necessary to resolve any issues in support for the mobile data computers or issues related to networking or connectivity between the two agencies involving the CAD system.

II. During the term of this Agreement, KPPCSD shall provide to Albany and be responsible for the following actions:

G. Police General Dispatch Service

1. Provide updated rosters for all personnel to Albany when KPPCSD staffing changes occur.
2. Notify Albany prior to conducting any special operations with an "OPS" plan, including personnel involved and location(s).
3. Conform to Albany incident call types and call disposition codes.
4. Follow established complaint procedures to address personnel and dispatching issues.
 - a. Orders received from the Albany Public Safety Communications Center are

official KPPCSD/Kensington Police Department orders and will be treated as such. Personnel receiving such orders shall comply.

- b. In the event of a dispute between an Albany dispatcher and KPPCSD field personnel, the dispute shall be referred to the employee's direct supervisor. That supervisor shall, in turn, contact the involved employee's direct supervisor in the other agency for resolution.
- c. Issues unrelated to personnel complaints should be addressed at the line supervisor level initially. If resolution isn't achieved for any type of issue, it shall be forwarded to the appointed agency liaison for resolution.
- d. Proposed operational or procedural changes should be directed to the Albany Administrative Sergeant and KPPCSD liaison.

H. Computer-Aided Dispatch and Records Management System

1. Establish and maintain its own telephone line(s) services required of this Agreement.
2. Process all paperwork related to the records function including, but not limited to, records data entry, citation entry, or miscellaneous paperwork not related to the basic dispatch function and respond to Public Records Act requests or similar requests and subpoenas for incidents and/or addresses located in KPPCSD.
3. Submit a request to create a network account and accounts for CAD and/or RMS applications for a new hire to Albany.
4. Notify Albany immediately of any separated KPPCSD employee so that the respective network and CAD/RMS accounts can be deactivated.
5. Manage RMS user accounts, all agency specific code table maintenance, UCR, and ad hoc reporting.
6. Purchase and install RMS on KPPCSD's workstations.
7. Support KPPCSD's records workstations. Albany will assist KPPCSD as necessary to resolve any issues; however, KPPCSD is responsible for any costs associated with the resolution of an issue if it is not related to the RMS application.
8. Provide all ad hoc reporting (using RiMS Reports or other tools) from the CAD data warehouse and RMS database. KPPCSD will be provided access to the databases to create the necessary reports.

I. Network Connectivity

1. Provide and maintain a dedicated connection to Albany's core network including the installation and maintenance of network connections.

J. Ancillary Services

1. KPPCSD will be responsible for CJIS audits, yearly training and sign-offs for KPPCSD.
2. KPPCSD will be responsible for lawful operation and use, and security of, CAD, RMS, MDC systems and their associated data, including but not limited to CLETS, Criminal Offender Record information (CORI), and Personally Identifiable Information (PII), and
3. Maintain and manage the ORI (Originating Agency Identifier) and mnemonics for KPPCSD, if the DOJ does not approve the consolidated CAD network and

system to be one system. If the DOJ approves the consolidated CAD network and system to be one system, Albany will be responsible for the ORI and mnemonics for KPPCSD.

K. Mobile Data Computer (MDC) System

1. Provide CAD and RMS compatible MDC hardware and software.
2. Provide hardware support for the mobile data computers or issues related to networking or connectivity between the two agencies. Albany will assist KPPCSD as necessary to resolve any issues; however, KPPCSD is responsible for any costs associated with the resolution of an issue if it is not related to the CAD application.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT
WITH
GLASS ASSOCIATES, INC.

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this ____ day of April ___, 2017 ("Effective Date"), by and between the Kensington Police Protection Community Service District ("Kensington"), and Glass Associates, Inc., professional architects, a California corporation ("Consultant").

RECITALS

A. Kensington proposes to utilize the services of Consultant as an independent contractor to provide architectural and design services as more fully described herein; and

B. Consultant represents that it has that degree of specialized expertise contemplated within California Government Code Section 37103, and holds all necessary licenses to practice and perform the services herein contemplated; and

C. Kensington and Consultant desire to contract for the specific services described in Exhibit "A" (the "Project") and desire to set forth their rights, duties and liabilities in connection with the services to be performed; and

D. No official or employee of Kensington has a financial interest, within the provisions of Sections 1090-1092 of the California Government Code, in the subject matter of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1.0 SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY CONSULTANT

1.1 Scope of Services. Consultant shall provide the professional services described in the Glass Associates, Inc. Response to Request for Proposal attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

1.2 Professional Practices. All professional services to be provided by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement shall be provided by personnel experienced in their respective fields and in a manner consistent with the standards of care, diligence and skill ordinarily exercised by professional consultants in similar fields and circumstances in accordance with sound professional practices. Consultant also warrants that it is familiar with all laws that may affect its performance of this Agreement and shall advise Kensington of any changes in any laws that may affect Consultant's performance of this Agreement.

1.3 Performance to Satisfaction of Kensington. Consultant agrees to perform all the work to the complete satisfaction of the Kensington and within the hereinafter specified. Evaluations of the work will

be done by the District Manager or his or her designee. If the quality of work is not satisfactory, Kensington in its discretion has the right to:

- (a) Meet with Consultant to review the quality of the work and resolve the matters of concern;
- (b) Require Consultant to repeat the work at no additional fee until it is satisfactory; and/or
- (c) Terminate the Agreement as hereinafter set forth.

1.4. Warranty. Consultant warrants that it shall perform the services required by this Agreement in compliance with all applicable Federal and California employment laws, including, but not limited to, those laws related to minimum hours and wages; occupational health and safety; fair employment and employment practices; workers' compensation insurance and safety in employment; and all other Federal, State and local laws and ordinances applicable to the services required under this Agreement. Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless Kensington from and against all claims, demands, payments, suits, actions, proceedings, and judgments of every nature and description including attorneys' fees and costs, presented, brought, or recovered against Kensington for, or on account of any liability under any of the above-mentioned laws, which may be incurred by reason of Consultant's performance under this Agreement.

1.5. Non-discrimination. In performing this Agreement, Consultant shall not engage in, nor permit its agents to engage in, discrimination in employment of persons because of their race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, age, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, sexual gender or sexual orientation, except as permitted pursuant to Section 12940 of the Government Code.

1.6. Non-Exclusive Agreement. Consultant acknowledges that Kensington may enter into agreements with other consultants for services similar to the services that are subject to this Agreement or may have its own employees perform services similar to those services contemplated by this Agreement.

1.7. Delegation and Assignment. This is a personal service contract, and the duties set forth herein shall not be delegated or assigned to any person or entity without the prior written consent of Kensington. Consultant may engage a subcontractor(s) as permitted by law and may employ other personnel to perform services contemplated by this Agreement at Consultant's sole cost and expense.

1.8. Confidentiality. Employees of Consultant in the course of their duties may have access to financial, accounting, statistical, or personnel data regarding private individuals and employees of Kensington. Consultant covenants that all data developed or received by Consultant or provided for performance of this Agreement are deemed confidential and shall not be disclosed by Consultant without written authorization by Kensington. Kensington shall grant such authorization if disclosure is required by law. All Kensington data shall be returned to Kensington upon the termination of this Agreement. Consultant's covenant under this Section shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

2.0. COMPENSATION AND BILLING

2.1. Compensation. Consultant shall be paid in accordance with the fee schedule set forth in Exhibit A. Consultant's total compensation shall not exceed One Hundred Forty-Nine Thousand and Town Hundred Dollars; (\$ 149,200.00).

2.2. Additional Services. Consultant shall not receive compensation for any services provided outside the scope of services specified in the Consultant's Proposal unless Kensington or the Project Manager for this Project, prior to Consultant performing the additional services, approves such additional services in writing. It is specifically understood that oral requests and/or approvals of such additional services or additional compensation shall be barred and are unenforceable.

2.3. Method of Billing. Consultant may submit invoices to Kensington for approval on a progress basis, but no more often than one time per month. Said invoice shall be based on the total of all Consultant's services which have been completed to Kensington's sole satisfaction. Kensington shall pay Consultant's invoice within thirty (30) days from the date Kensington receives said invoice. Each invoice shall describe in detail, the services performed, the date of performance, and the associated time for completion. Any additional services approved and performed pursuant to this Agreement shall be designated as "Additional Services" and shall identify the number of the authorized change order, where applicable, on all invoices.

2.4 Final Payment. Prior to issuance of final payment, Consultant shall furnish to the District two sets of final Record Drawings ("as built") and certify that Contractor has performed the work required.

2.5. Records and Audits. Records of Consultant's services relating to this Agreement shall be maintained in accordance with generally recognized accounting principles and shall be made available to Kensington or its Project Manager for inspection and/or audit at mutually convenient times for a period of three (3) years from the Effective Date.

3.0. TIME OF PERFORMANCE

3.1. Commencement and Completion of Work. The professional services to be performed pursuant to this Agreement shall commence within five (5) days from the Effective Date of this Agreement. Failure to commence work in a timely manner and/or diligently pursue work to completion may be grounds for termination of this Agreement.

3.2 Timely Coordination. Consultant shall coordinate with various County agencies in a timely manner, and make required adjustments necessary to Consultant's drawings, plans, etc. so that they will satisfy the requirements of an issuance of a building permit.

3.3. Excusable Delays. Neither party shall be responsible for delays or lack of performance resulting from acts beyond the reasonable control of the party or parties. Such acts shall include, but not be limited to, acts of God, fire, strikes, material shortages, compliance with laws or regulations, riots, acts of war, or any other conditions beyond the reasonable control of a party.

4.0. TERM AND TERMINATION

4.1. Term. This Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date and continue through November 30, 2018, unless previously terminated as provided herein or otherwise agreed to in writing by the parties to be extended.

4.2. Notice of Termination. Kensington reserves and has the right and privilege of canceling, suspending or abandoning the execution of all or any part of the work contemplated by this Agreement, with or without cause, at any time, by providing written notice to Consultant. Termination of this Agreement shall be deemed effective upon receipt of the notice of termination. In the event of such termination, Consultant shall immediately stop rendering services under this Agreement unless directed otherwise by Kensington.

4.3. Compensation. In the event of termination, Kensington shall pay Consultant for reasonable costs incurred and professional services satisfactorily performed up to and including the date of Kensington's written notice of termination. Compensation for work in progress shall be prorated based on the percentage of work completed as of the effective date of termination in accordance with the fees set forth herein. In ascertaining the professional services actually rendered hereunder up to the effective date of termination of this Agreement, consideration shall be given to both completed work and work in progress, to complete and incomplete drawings, and to other documents pertaining to the services contemplated herein whether delivered to Kensington or in the possession of the Consultant.

4.4. Documents. In the event of termination of this Agreement, all documents prepared by Consultant in its performance of this Agreement including, but not limited to, finished or unfinished design, development and construction documents, data studies, drawings, maps and reports, shall be delivered to the Kensington within ten (10) days of delivery of termination notice to Consultant, at no cost to Kensington. Any use of uncompleted documents without specific written authorization from Consultant shall be at Kensington's sole risk and without liability or legal expense to Consultant.

5.0. INSURANCE

5.1. Minimum Scope and Limits of Insurance. Consultant shall obtain, maintain, and keep in full force and effect during the life of this Agreement all of the following minimum scope of insurance coverages with an insurance company admitted to do business in California, rated "A," Class X, or better in the most recent Best's Key Insurance Rating Guide, and approved by

- (a) Commercial general including premises-operations, products/completed operations, broad form property damage, blanket contractual liability, independent contractors, personal injury or bodily injury with a policy limit of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000 combined single limits, per occurrence. If such insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this Agreement or shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
- (b) Business automobile liability for owned vehicles, hired, and non-owned vehicles, with a policy limit of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) combined single limits, per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage.
- (c) Workers' compensation insurance as required by the State of California. Consultant agrees to waive, and to obtain endorsements from its workers' compensation insurer waiving subrogation rights under its workers' compensation insurance policy against the Kensington, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers arising from work performed by Consultant for the Kensington and to require each of its subcontractors, if any, to do _____ likewise
under their workers' compensation insurance policies.
- (d) Professional errors and omissions ("E&O") liability insurance with policy limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), combined single limits, per occurrence and aggregate. Architects' and engineers' coverage shall be endorsed to include contractual liability. If the policy is written as a "claims made" policy, the retro date shall be prior to the start of the contract work. Consultant shall obtain and maintain, said E&O liability insurance during the

life of this Agreement and for three years after completion of the work hereunder.

5.2. Endorsements. The commercial general liability insurance policy and business automobile liability policy shall contain or be endorsed to contain the following provisions:

- (a) Additional insureds: "Kensington and its elected and appointed boards, officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers are additional insureds with respect to: liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of the Consultant pursuant to its contract with Kensington; products and completed operations of the Consultant; premises owned, occupied or used by the Consultant; automobiles owned, leased, hired, or borrowed by the Consultant."
- (b) Notice: "Said policy shall not terminate, be suspended, or voided, nor shall it be cancelled, nor the coverage or limits reduced, until thirty (30) days after written notice is given to Kensington."
- (c) Other insurance: "The Consultant's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects Kensington, its officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers. Any other insurance maintained by the Kensington shall be excess and not contributing with the insurance provided by this policy."
- (d) Any failure to comply with the reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided to Kensington, its officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers.
- (e) The Consultant's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurers liability.

5.3. Deductible or Self Insured Retention. If any of such policies provide for a deductible or self-insured retention to provide such coverage, the amount of such deductible or self-insured retention shall be approved in advance by Kensington. No policy of insurance issued as to which Kensington is an additional insured shall contain a provision which requires that no insured except the named insured can satisfy any such deductible or self-insured retention.

5.4. Certificates of Insurance. Consultant shall provide to Kensington certificates of insurance showing the insurance coverages and required endorsements described above, in a form and content approved by Kensington, prior to performing any services under this Agreement. The certificates of insurance shall be attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by this reference.

5.5. Non-limiting. Nothing in this Section shall be construed as limiting in any way, for the indemnification provision contained in this Agreement, or the extent to which Consultant may be held responsible for payments of damages to persons or property.

6.0. GENERAL PROVISIONS

6.1. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to any matter referenced herein and supersedes any and all other prior writings and oral negotiations. This Agreement may be modified only in writing, and signed by the parties in interest at

the time of such modification. The terms of this Agreement shall prevail over any inconsistent provision in any other contract document appurtenant hereto, including exhibits to this Agreement.

6.2. Representatives. Kensington's General Manager or his or her designee shall be the representative of Kensington for purposes of this Agreement and may issue all consents, approvals, directives and agreements on behalf of Kensington, called for by this Agreement, except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement.

Consultant shall designate a representative for purposes of this Agreement who shall be authorized to issue all consents, approvals, directives and agreements on behalf of Consultant called for by this Agreement, except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement.

6.3. Project Managers. Kensington shall designate a Project Manager to work directly with Consultant in the performance of this Agreement.

Consultant shall designate a Project Manager who shall represent it and be its agent in all consultations with Kensington during the term of this Agreement. Consultant or its Project Manager shall attend and assist in all coordination meetings called by Kensington.

6.4. Notices. Any notices, documents, correspondence or other communications concerning this Agreement or the work hereunder may be provided by personal delivery, facsimile or mail and shall be addressed as set forth below. Such communication shall be deemed served or delivered: a) at the time of delivery if such communication is sent by personal delivery; b) at the time of transmission if such communication is sent by facsimile; and c) 48 hours after deposit in the U.S. Mail as reflected by the official U.S. postmark if such communication is sent through regular United States mail.

6.5. Drug-free Workplace Policy. Consultant shall provide a drug-free workplace by complying with local, state, and federal laws. Consultant's failure to conform to the requirements shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement and shall be cause for immediate termination of this Agreement by Kensington.

6.6. Attorney's Fees. In the event that litigation is brought by any party in connection with this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the opposing party all costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, incurred by the prevailing party in the exercise of any of its rights or remedies hereunder or the enforcement of any of the terms, conditions, or provisions hereof.

6.7. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the State of California without giving effect to that body of laws pertaining to conflict of laws. In the event of any legal action to enforce or interpret this Agreement, the parties hereto agree that the sole and exclusive venue shall be a county of competent jurisdiction located in Contra Costa County, California.

6.8. Assignment. Consultant shall not or by operation of law assign, transfer, sublet or encumber all or any part of Consultant's interest in this Agreement without Kensington's prior written consent. Any attempted assignment, transfer, subletting or encumbrance shall be void and shall constitute a breach of this Agreement and cause for termination of this Agreement. Regardless of Kensington's consent, no subletting or assignment shall release Consultant of Consultant's obligation to perform all other obligations to be performed by Consultant hereunder for the term of this Agreement.

6.9. Indemnification and Hold Harmless. Consultant agrees to defend, indemnify, hold free and harmless Kensington, its elected officials, officers, agents and employees, at Consultant's sole expense, from and against any and all claims, actions, suits or other legal proceedings brought against Kensington, its elected officials, officers, agents and employees arising out of the performance of the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors, of the work undertaken pursuant to this Agreement. The defense obligation provided for hereunder shall apply without any advance showing of negligence or wrongdoing by the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors, but shall be required whenever any claim, action, complaint, or suit asserts as its basis the negligence, errors, omissions or misconduct of the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors, and/or whenever any claim, action, complaint or suit asserts liability against Kensington, its elected officials, officers, agents and employees based upon the work performed by the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors under this Agreement, whether or not the Consultant, its employees, and/or authorized subcontractors are specifically named or otherwise asserted to be liable. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Consultant shall not be liable for the defense or indemnification of Kensington for claims, actions, complaints or suits arising out of the sole active negligence or willful misconduct of Kensington. This provision shall supersede and replace all other indemnity provisions contained either in Kensington's specifications or Consultant's Proposal, which shall be of no force and effect.

6.10. Independent Contractor. Consultant is and shall be acting at all times as an independent contractor and not as an employee of Kensington. Consultant shall have no power to incur any debt, obligation, or liability on behalf of Kensington or otherwise act on behalf of Kensington as an agent. Neither Kensington nor any of its agents shall have control over the conduct of Consultant or any of Consultant's employees, except as set forth in this Agreement. Consultant shall not, at any time, or in any manner, represent that it or any of its or employees are in any manner agents or employees of Kensington. Consultant shall secure, at its sole expense, and be responsible for any and all payment of Income Tax, Social Security, State Disability Insurance Compensation, Unemployment Compensation, and other payroll deductions for Consultant and its officers, agents, and employees, and all business licenses, if any are required, in connection with the services to be performed hereunder. Consultant shall indemnify and hold Kensington harmless from any and all taxes, assessments, penalties, and interest asserted against Kensington by reason of the independent contractor relationship created by this Agreement. Consultant further agrees to indemnify and hold Kensington harmless from any failure of Consultant to comply with the applicable worker's compensation laws. Kensington shall have the right to offset against the amount of any fees due to Consultant under this Agreement any amount due to Kensington from Consultant as a result of Consultant's failure to promptly pay to Kensington any reimbursement or indemnification arising under this paragraph.

6.11. Indemnification for PERS claim. In the event that Consultant or any employee, agent, or subcontractor of Consultant providing services under this Agreement claims or is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction or the California Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) to be eligible

for enrollment in PERS as an employee of the Kensington, Consultant shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless Kensington for the payment of any employee and/or employer contributions for PERS benefits on behalf of Consultant or its employees, agents, or subcontractors, as well as for the payment of any penalties and interest on such contributions, which would otherwise be the obligation of Kensington.

Notwithstanding any other agency, state or federal policy, rule, regulation, or ordinance, Consultant and any of its employees, agents, and subcontractors providing service under this Agreement shall not qualify for or become entitled to, and hereby agree to waive any claims to, any compensation, benefit, or any incident of employment by Kensington, including but not limited to eligibility to enroll in PERS as an employee of Kensington and entitlement to any contribution to be paid by Kensington for employer contribution and/or employee contributions for PERS benefits.

6.12. Cooperation. In the event any claim or action is brought against Kensington relating to Consultant's performance or services rendered under this Agreement, Consultant shall render any reasonable assistance and cooperation which Kensington might require.

6.13. Ownership of Documents. All findings, reports, documents, information and data including, but not limited to, computer tapes or discs, files and tapes furnished or prepared by Consultant or any of its subcontractors in the course of performance of this Agreement, shall be and remain the sole property of Kensington. Consultant agrees that any such documents or information shall not be made available to any individual or organization without the prior consent of Kensington. Any use of such documents for other projects not contemplated by this Agreement, and any use of incomplete documents, shall be at the sole risk of Kensington and without liability or legal exposure to Consultant. Kensington shall indemnify and hold harmless Consultant from all claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including attorneys' fees, arising out of or resulting from Kensington's use of such documents for other projects not contemplated by this Agreement or use of incomplete documents furnished by Consultant. Consultant shall deliver to Kensington any findings, reports, documents, information, data, in any form, including but not limited to, computer tapes, discs, files audio tapes or any other Project related items as requested by Kensington or its authorized representative, at no additional cost to the Kensington.

6.14. Public Records Act Disclosure. Consultant has been advised and is aware that this Agreement and all reports, documents, information and data, including, but not limited to, computer tapes, discs or files furnished or prepared by Consultant, or any of its subcontractors, pursuant to this Agreement and provided to Kensington may be subject to public disclosure as required by the California Public Records Act (California Government Code Section 6250 et seq.). Exceptions to public disclosure may be those documents or information that qualify as trade secrets, as that term is defined in the California Government Code Section 6254.7, and of which Consultant informs Kensington of such trade secret. The Kensington will endeavor to maintain as confidential all information obtained by it that is designated as a trade secret. The Kensington shall not, in any way, be liable or responsible for the disclosure of any trade secret including, without limitation, those reports marked If disclosure is deemed to be required by law or by order of the Court.

6.15. Conflict of Interest. Consultant and its officers, employees, associates and subconsultants, if any, will comply with all conflict of interest statutes of the State of California applicable to Consultant's services under this agreement, including, but not limited to, the Political Reform Act (Government Code Sections 81000, et seq.) and Government Code Section 1090. During the term of this Agreement, Consultant and its officers, employees, associates and subconsultants shall not, without the prior written approval of the Kensington Project Manager, perform work for another person or entity for whom Consultant is not currently performing work that would require Consultant or one of its officers,

employees, associates or subconsultants to abstain from a decision under this Agreement pursuant to a conflict of interest statute.

6.16. Responsibility for Errors. Consultant shall be responsible for its work and results under this Agreement. Consultant, when requested, shall furnish clarification and/or explanation as may be required by the Kensington's representative, regarding any services rendered under this Agreement at no additional cost to Kensington. In the event that an error or omission attributable to Consultant occurs, then Consultant shall, at no cost to Kensington, provide all necessary design drawings, estimates and other Consultant professional services necessary to rectify and correct the matter to the sole satisfaction of Kensington and to participate in any meeting required with regard to the correction.

6.17. Prohibited Employment. Consultant will not employ any regular employee of Kensington while this Agreement is in effect.

6.18. Order of Precedence. In the event of an inconsistency in this Agreement and any of the attached Exhibits, the terms set forth in this Agreement shall prevail. If, and to the extent this Agreement incorporates by reference any provision of any document, such provision shall be deemed a part of this Agreement. Nevertheless, if there is any conflict among the terms and conditions of this Agreement and those of any such provision or provisions so incorporated by reference, this Agreement shall govern over the document referenced.

6.19. Costs. Each party shall bear its own costs and fees incurred in the preparation and negotiation of this Agreement and in the performance of its obligations hereunder except as expressly provided herein.

6.20. No Third Party Beneficiary Rights. This Agreement is entered into for the sole benefit of Kensington and Consultant and no other parties are intended to be direct or incidental beneficiaries of this Agreement and no third party shall have any right in, under or to this Agreement.

6.21. Headings. Paragraphs and subparagraph headings contained in this Agreement are included solely for convenience and are not intended to modify, explain or to be a full or accurate description of the content thereof and shall not in any way affect the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement.

6.22. Construction. The parties have participated jointly in the negotiation and drafting of this Agreement. In the event an ambiguity or question of intent or interpretation arises with respect to this Agreement, this Agreement shall be construed as if drafted jointly by the parties and in accordance with its fair meaning. There shall be no presumption or burden of proof favoring or disfavoring any party by virtue of the authorship of any of the provisions of this Agreement.

6.23. Amendments. Only writings executed by the parties hereto or their respective successors and assigns may amend this Agreement.

6.24. Waiver. The delay or failure of either party at any time to require performance or compliance by the other of any of its obligations or agreements shall in no way be deemed a waiver of those rights to require such performance or compliance. No waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be effective unless in writing and signed by a duly authorized representative of the party against whom enforcement of a waiver is sought. The waiver of any right or remedy in respect to any occurrence or event shall not be deemed a waiver of any right or remedy in respect to any other occurrence or event, nor shall any waiver constitute a continuing waiver.

6.25. Severability. If any provision of this Agreement is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable in any circumstance, such determination shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining terms and provisions hereof or of the offending provision in any other circumstance. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the value of this Agreement, based upon the substantial benefit of the bargain for any party, is materially impaired, which determination made by the presiding court or arbitrator of competent jurisdiction shall be binding, then both parties agree to substitute such provision(s) through good faith negotiations.

6.26. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original. All counterparts shall be construed together and shall constitute one agreement.

6.27. Authority to Sign. Only the persons executing this Agreement on behalf of the parties hereto warrant that they are duly authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of said parties and that by doing so the parties hereto are formally bound to the provisions of this Agreement.

6.28. Exhibits. The following documents are exhibits to this Agreement and incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein:

Per your request, the following revised PROPOSAL FOR ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES:

General. The project proposes alterations to the Kensington Community Center to remedy structural and access deficiencies and improve the general appearance and functionality of the building. The following description and scope are drawn from the District's Request for Proposals:

The Kensington Community Center is located at 59 Arlington Avenue, Kensington. It was constructed in 1956 and remodeled and expanded in 1988. The building's total area of 4,430 square feet includes a main assembly room of 1,815 square feet. There are three other meeting rooms, toilet rooms, a kitchen that does not meet commercial standards, and a small storage area. The building is utilitarian in design, consisting of reinforced concrete block walls, slab on grade floor with resilient tile surface, exposed ceiling structure with skylights and exposed metal trusses. There is no insulation in the main room and heating is provided by space heaters, with ventilation provided by operable windows and doors.

The building was initially constructed to serve the needs of Kensington's youth, hence its original name as the "Youth Hut." Over the years the building's purpose evolved to include more adult uses, such as yoga, painting classes, and an occasional venue for private parties. However, the majority of uses continue to have a youth focus (scouts/gymnastics/after school programs). Given these uses, upgrades will need to recognize the importance of durability, such as impact-resistant glazing on any windows and doors, and surfaces that are scuff-resistant and designed for easy cleanup. The building's western exposure creates heat gain issues during the afternoon, which should be considered. The construction scope will include, but may not be limited to:

- A. Modifications required to remedy seismic resistance deficiencies identified in the "Kensington Community Center Seismic Study" dated October 29, 2015, prepared by District's consultant, Gregory Paul Wallace.
- B. Modifications required to remedy accessibility deficiencies identified in the "CASp Accessibility Survey: Kensington Youth Hut" dated October 12, 2015, prepared by the District's consultant, GPPA Architects.
- C. Life safety, lighting, electrical, and building envelope modifications required to meet the requirements of the California Building Code (CBC), including the Title 24 energy requirements of the CBC.
- D. Optional modifications to improve the general appearance and function of the building and site. Among these are various improvements proposed by the District, including a new west wall that will provide an indoor/outdoor feel by incorporating more use of glass and a possible central entrance. Other options would include upgraded finishes beyond the modifications required to meet code for the kitchen, restrooms and the main meeting space.
- E. At this time it is anticipated that the total project budget, including fees and permits, will be \$1,000,000 or less.

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Notes:

- The proposed Services include Design and Construction Documents for items A-D (including options mentioned in item D). The Architect has reviewed with the Owner, and the Owner acknowledges, that the proposed budget may not be sufficient to construct all aspects of the project included in items A-D. The Architect will, therefore, include in the Basic Scope of the Construction Documents those items necessary to complete the proposed seismic upgrades and the additional items triggered by that work to meet the California Building Code. This scope is included in items A-C referenced above. The options listed in item D will be included in the Construction Documents as individual bid "Add Alternates." **It is important to note that all aspects of the project that the District wishes to consider should be included in the Construction Documents for bid purposes. This will allow the District to select any options it chooses should the budget allow. The costs of adding items to the scope after the bid process and the selection of a Contractor will be measurably higher than if included in the Construction Documents at time of bidding.** There are no additional consultant fees proposed for this approach to the scope of the Architect's services.

- h. Review and certification of Contractor's Application(s) for Payment, and determining the dates of Substantial and Final Completion.
- i. Preparation of Project Completion List ("Punch List") defining items requiring completion by contractor prior to release of construction contract retention.

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7. Optional Services: The following, if required by the project and requested by the District, can be added to the Scope of Services as optional additional services:

Schedule.

- a. As requested, our fees are proposed as "Lump Sum." Consultant fees are passed through at direct cost. Architectural fees include our time for coordinating consultant services. The amount of our liability insurance premium costs affected by gross receipts, including consultant fees, is included in our overhead. Our consultants have worked with us on numerous previous projects and we are confident in their ability to successfully execute their project responsibilities.
- b. With certain exceptions, the California Building Code (CBC) and the access provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) mandate equivalent access for all users and patrons of public accommodations and for employees of businesses and institutions, whether serving the public or not. Renovation/remodel projects trigger general path of travel upgrades under the California Building Code (CBC) and the provisions of the Americans with Disability Act (ADA) and subsequent related legislation. Our services will include a detailed assessment of access compliance, including path of travel upgrades and access for restrooms. The District has included a CASp Accessibility Survey report prepared by Gilda Puente Peters. We do not, therefore, include a CASp compliance report in our scope.
- c. Reimbursable expenses projected above are allowances based on our experience with previous projects. We will periodically review these allowances with you and increase them only if necessary. These expenses include plotting and printing costs for presentations and submittal requirements (not printing or plotting for "in-house" coordination or other similar uses), courier, and FedEx shipping charges. It is anticipated that printing of bid and construction documents will be provided by the District at your preferential vendor rates. These costs are, therefore, not included in the above allowances.

The first step of the process is the approval of Resolution 2017-09; the approval of the Annual Report for the Kensington Park Assessment District for Fiscal Year 2017/2018.

The second step in the process is the approval of Resolution 2017-10; the approval of the Annual Report for the Kensington Park Assessment District for Fiscal Year 2017/2018. A copy of the report titled, "Kensington Park Assessment District Annual Report Fiscal year 2017/2018" is attached to the resolution for review and Board approval.

The third step of the process is the approval of Resolution 2017-11; the Board's declaring its intention to levy and collect assessments for the Kensington Park Assessment District for Fiscal Year 2017/2018 and set the public hearing for Thursday April 27 at 7:30 PM. Once Resolution 2017-09 is passed, it will need to be published in the local paper at least 10 days prior to June 8th, 2017 public meeting.

The total assessment to each dwelling unit is \$16.65 which is an increase from \$16.09 last year, with a total of 2,188 parcels to be assessed. The total balance to levy will be \$37, 503.01. This revenue can only be used for maintenance of the "New Park."

The final step in the process will be the holding of the public meeting on June 8th, 2017, and the approval of Resolution 2017-12.

General Manager Recommendation: Discuss the item, take public comment, and approve the Resolutions.

Fiscal Impact: Anticipated revenue received \$37,503.01. Included with preliminary budget.

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1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Board of Directors of the Kensington Police Protection and Community Services District ("KPPCSD"), State of California, has directed NBS Government Finance Group, DBA NBS ("NBS"), to prepare and file a report presenting plans and specifications describing the general nature, location, and extent of the improvements to be maintained and an estimate of the costs of the maintenance and operations and servicing of the improvements for the Kensington Park Assessment District (the "District") for Fiscal Year 2017/18 pursuant to the provisions of the *Landscape and Lighting Act of 1972, Part 2, Division 15 of the California Streets and Highways Code (commencing with Section 22500)* (hereafter referred to as the "Act").

The report includes a diagram for the District, showing the area and properties proposed to be assessed, an assessment of the estimated costs of the maintenance, operations and servicing the improvements, and the net amount upon all assessable lots and/or parcels within the District in proportion to the special benefit received.

The assessment rate and the annual rate escalation factor of the annual San Francisco Bay Area CPI were approved by property owners through the assessment balloting procedures set forth in Section 4 of Article XIID of the California Constitution following a public hearing on May 28, 1997.

The following assessment is made to cover the portion of the estimated costs of maintenance, operation, and servicing of said improvements to be paid by the assessable real property within the District in proportion to the special benefit received.

2. OVERVIEW

2.1. Introduction

On December 6, 1994, KPPCSD formed the District for the purpose of providing improvements which benefit parcels in the District. Since that time, the District has been levying and collecting special assessments to pay for maintaining and servicing those improvements.

This Engineer's Report ("Report") describes the District and the proposed charge per Equivalent Dwelling Unit (EDU) for Fiscal Year 2017/18 based on the historical and estimated costs to maintain the improvements and to provide the services that benefit parcels within the District. Maintenance and operation of the facilities provides a healthy alternative for youth and adult activities while protecting the capital investments that have been made within the District.

The word "parcel," for the purposes of this Report, refers to an individual property assigned its own Assessor's Parcel Number by the Contra Costa County Assessor's Office. The Contra Costa County Auditor/Controller uses Assessor's Parcel Numbers and specific Fund Numbers, to identify on the tax roll, properties assessed for special district benefit assessments.

Following consideration of public comments at a noticed public hearing, the Board of Directors may confirm the diagram and may order the levy and collection of assessments for Fiscal Year 2017/18. If approved, the assessment information shall be submitted to the Contra Costa County Auditor/Controller and included on the property tax roll for each benefiting parcel for Fiscal Year 2017/18.

2.2. Effect of Proposition 218

On November 5, 1996, California voters approved Proposition 218 by a margin of 56.5% to 43.5%. The provisions of the Proposition, now California Constitutional Articles XIII C and XIII D, adds substantive and procedural requirements to assessments, which affect the KPPCSD maintenance assessments.

The assessment rate and the annual rate escalation factor of the annual San Francisco Bay Area CPI were approved by property owners through the assessment balloting procedures set forth in Section 4 of Proposition 218 following a public hearing on May 28, 1997. The San Francisco Bay Area CPI increase for the period ending February 2017 was 3.44%.

2.3. Description of District and Services

The District operates, services, and maintains the following improvements:

- Landscaping and grass
- Water and electric services
- Equipment and supplies
- Repair or replacement of existing improvements
- Addition of future improvements (if determined to be necessary)

The District consists of a residential area, generally located north of the Contra Costa County line, east of Santa Fe Avenue, west of Kensington Road and south of Gelston Place.

3. ESTIMATE OF COSTS

3.1. Description of Budget Items

Operations & Maintenance - Includes the following:

Tree Pruning/Removal – Includes the costs for trimming trees and removal of debris.

Utilities – Includes the costs for water to irrigate the landscaping and the costs for electricity for street lighting.

Miscellaneous Services/Equipment – Includes the costs for maintaining and replenishing equipment and supplies.

Miscellaneous Repairs – Includes any infrastructure repair on District Property, including repairs to buildings.

Incidental Expenses - Includes the following:

Administrative Services – Includes services necessary for District maintenance, including preparation of the Annual Engineer's Report and expenses for the services of KPPCSD personnel.

Levy Fees – Includes the County of Contra Costa parcel charges to collect the assessments on the County Tax Roll.

4. METHOD OF APPORTIONMENT

4.1. Method of Apportionment

Pursuant to the Act, the costs of the District may be apportioned by any formula or method which fairly distributes the net amount to be assessed among all assessable parcels in proportion to the estimated special benefit to be received by each such parcel from the maintenance, servicing, and operation of the improvements. The formula used for the District reflects the composition of the parcels and the improvements and services provided to fairly apportion the costs based on the estimated benefits to each parcel.

The benefit was determined to be equal for all Equivalent Dwelling Units (EDU) within the District.

Kensington Park Assessment District

The method used to calculate the assessments within the District is as follows:

$$\text{Total Balance to Levy} / \text{Total EDU} = \text{Levy per EDU}$$

To determine the EDU for assessable parcels, the Benefit Unit Factor (B.U.F.) is multiplied by the number of developed residential units on the parcel. Undeveloped and non-residential parcels are not assessed. The CPI Rate Escalation Factor is applied to the Levy per EDU each year.

The Operations and Maintenance are of special benefit to those parcels in the District. The benefit derived by the community at large is negligible and is considered a general benefit.

4.3. Balance To Levy

Total District Costs – Includes the Maintenance and Operations and Incidental costs determined above, in Section 3 of this Report.

Other Funding Sources – This is the amount of surplus or deficit funds resulting from the previous year's assessments. This can also include funds designated for use by the District that are not from District Assessments. These funds are added to or subtracted from the District account, and assessments adjusted accordingly.

Balance to Levy – This is the total amount to be levied and collected through assessments for the current fiscal year. The Balance to Levy represents the sum of the Maintenance and Operations, Incidental Expenses, Beginning Balance, (deficit or surplus from last year) and Other Funding Sources less installment rounding.

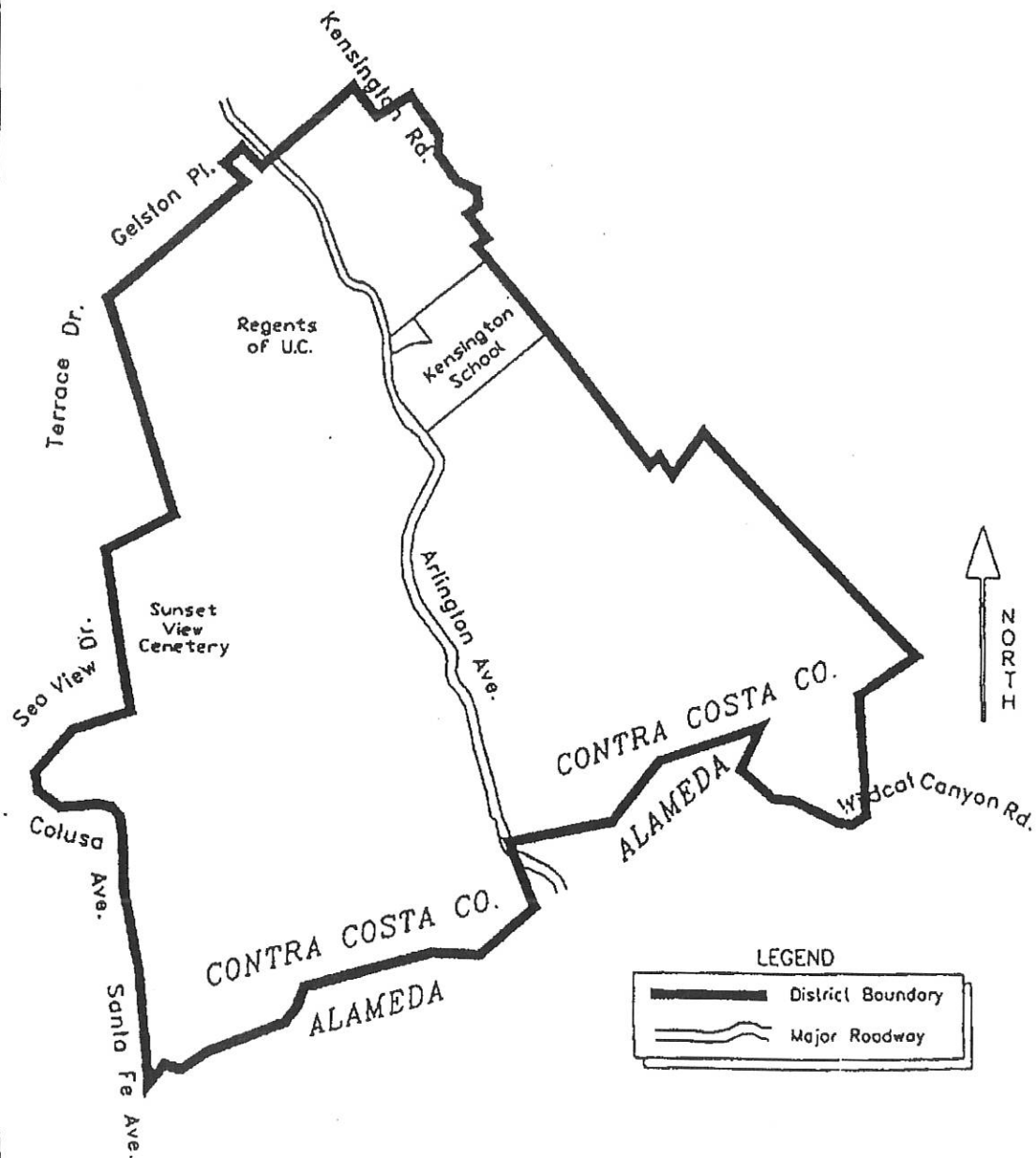
